Construction Update

Preliminary work is well underway for the Anzac Memorial Centenary Project following establishment of the site last month.


Two site access points are being constructed on Liverpool Street, and when complete in early December, these will be the main entry and exit to the site for construction equipment and materials. The impact to pedestrians, buses and local traffic along Liverpool Street will be minimal.

New hoarding and gates will be installed along Liverpool Street with additional information boards to provide the community with more information on the Anzac Memorial Centenary Project.

To the south of the Memorial, stone paving and park furniture within the site have been removed to allow for the upcoming excavation works.

Upcoming works

The next phase of construction will commence in December. Piling will start on the western and eastern sides of the Memorial to install structural supports to the existing building before the new construction takes place.

Excavation and dismantling of the stairs to the south of the Memorial will also begin to allow for the construction of the new water cascade and underground Hall of Service, interpretation and education facilities next year.

These works will continue through to January during standard work hours:
